

WorldPride 2028 Bidding Process



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About WorldPride

- InterPride's highest-profile signature event in partnership with a member Pride
 - Millions of participants worldwide building and celebrating a world with full cultural, social, and legal equity for all
 - Licensed by InterPride to a full member Pride organization
 - Based on 2-year cycle, but may be awarded at different intervals
 - Sydney WorldPride 2023 was the eighth edition, followed by Washington DC in 2025 and Amsterdam in 2026.
 - The Membership voted to receive bids for 2026
 - Will return to a two-year cycle afterwards
- Provisional license granted by membership vote
 - Governed by Standing Rule 06.01





Roles and Responsibilities_Stakeholders

Bidders

- Confirm eligibility
- Prepare and submit proposal
- Meet all requirements and deadlines
- Present at GM & WC in 2024

WorldPride Committee

- Oversee bidding process
- Work with bidders to ensure bid compliance and assess quality of bids
- Make recommendations on bids to the Board

Board

- Receive WP Committee recommendations
- Vote on sending compliant bids to the membership for a vote at the WC and GM

CSIC, Member Services, Co-Presidents

 Work with WP Committee to oversee presentation and voting process at WC&GM

Vote on bid selection



Requirements Single Applications

- Must be a current, Full Member Organization of InterPride and have been in good standing for at least 3 consecutive calendar years prior to submitting an application. No waivers may be granted for this requirement.
- Must have organized at least three 3 Pride Events (physical, virtual or hybrid) within the previous four 3 calendar years
- Must have attended 2 of the previous 3 InterPride's General Meeting and World Conferences, at least one (1) in person, immediately prior to the application.
 Attendance at a GM&WC requires a minimum of attending all plenaries and voting.
- The applicant organization must have attended at least one (1) previous
 WorldPride



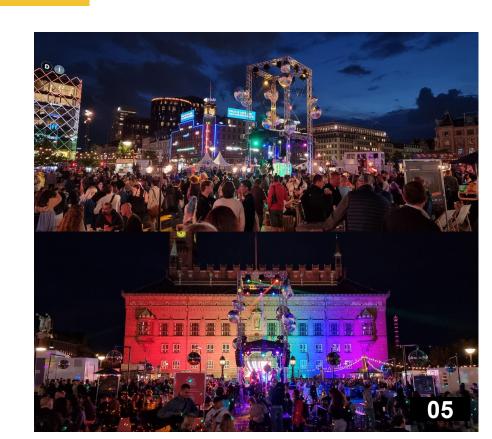
Requirements Single Applications

- The applicant organization must have no operating deficit exceeding ten (10) percent of revenues in the three (3) calendar year period immediately prior to their application. No waivers may be granted for this requirement.
- The applicant organization must propose to hold the WorldPride event at least three (3)
 years after their application is considered by the membership.
 - The WorldPride committee voted on taking the bids for 2028 in 2024.
- The applicant organization must be present at the GM&WC at which their application is considered.
- A non-refundable fee of USD \$500, submitted to the Treasurer of InterPride, must accompany applications.



Requirements Joint Applications

- Joint applications by multiple organizations
 must be submitted by a lead organization,
 which will fulfill the requirements of Section 2
 of the Standing rule and be accountable to
 InterPride for the delivery of the event. All
 applicants must be Full Members of
 InterPride.
- Joint applications must be for an event within a defined geographical area which would allow for reasonable travel by participants.

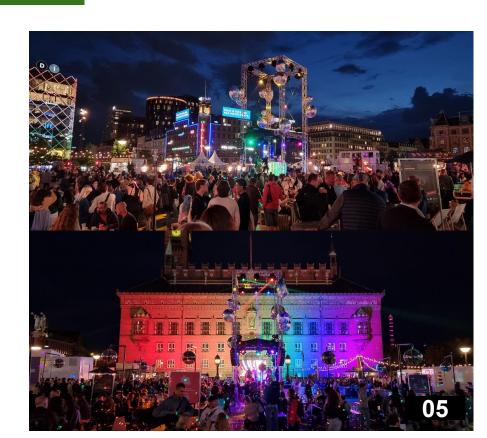




Campaigning Policy

SELECTED REQUIREMENTS SEE STANDING RULE 11.01 FOR FULL DETAILS

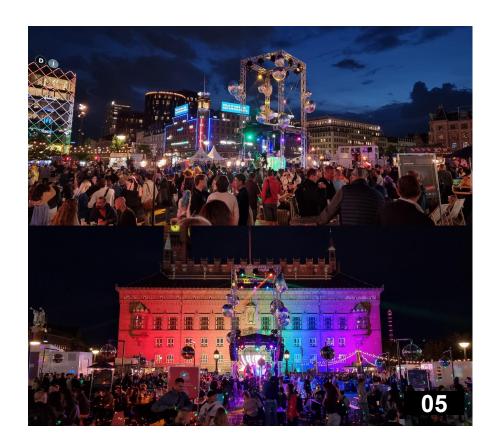
- Each candidate is expected to submit a campaigning budget during their bid in front of the membership of no more than USD \$50,000 including donations and sponsorships
- Must include any expenditures that benefited other members, such as registration fees or travel costs





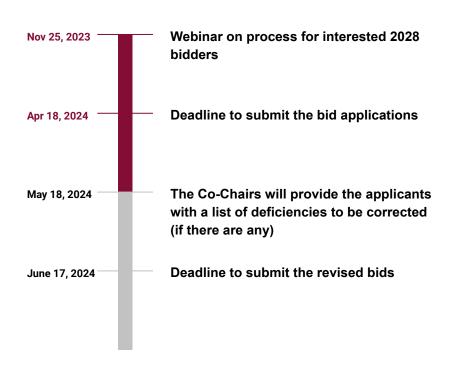
Campaigning Policy

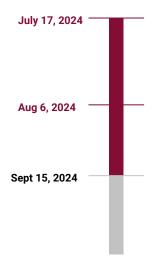
- Candidates are permitted to hand out gifts or financially support members provided these are disclosed publicly
- May not give members or representatives anything that has financial value in direct exchange for votes
- Board members of InterPride are not allowed to accept anything of monetary value from a bidding organization.





Process Timeline





WorldPride Committee will vote on whether to recommend the bid to the Board or not. The committee's recommendations will be sent to the Board.

The Board shall vote on whether to accept the recommendations of the WorldPride Committee

The Board shall send the successful applications to the Membership before the GM&WC where they shall vote on whether to grant the provisional WorldPride license.



Application content (full details in Standing Rule 06.01)

Selected application content (see Standing Rule 06.01 for full requirements)

- A. The proposed date(s) and geographic location(s) of the event(s).
 - a. Details of the proposed program, including:
 - b. an opening ceremony;
 - c. a march, parade or similar demonstration;
 - d. a human rights conference on various aspects/issues of LGBTQI+ life;
 - e. a closing ceremony;
 - f. an InterPride Membership Reception; and
 - g. a program including affordable and accessible events.
- B. A budget and business plan
- C. Funding strategy and marketing plan
- D. Signed intent-to-bid agreement

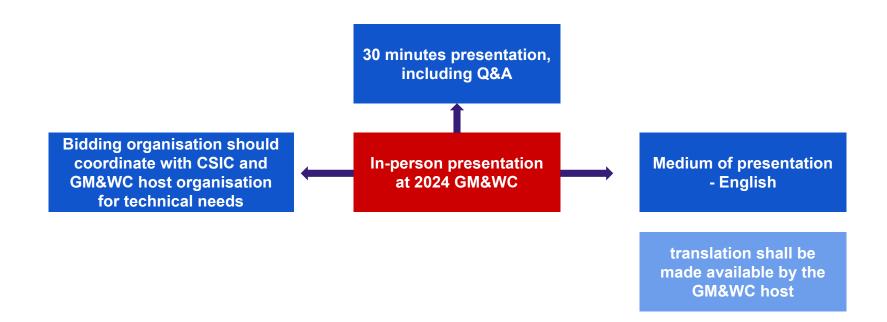
Supporting Documents

- Letters of support from:
 - organizations within the city/region/country where the event(s) will take place exhibiting their support
 - government officials (mayor, city council, governor, president, prime minister, etc.)
 - LGBTI+ businesses in the city/region/country of the event(s)
 - Media
 - prospective sponsors
 - local tourism authorities
 - travel partners (airlines, hotels, travel agents, car rental agencies, etc.) and other event partners
 - human rights organizations
- Attested financial documentation for the prior three years that demonstrate financial stability, including, but not limited to, balance sheets and audited financial statements.
